# Planning Report & Work Observed November - December

# Old Town

- Queen's Gardens - the process of planting semi-mature trees began in November.

- No. 2 Parliament St – permission was given in w/c 13/11 for the offices to become 4 flats.

- Whitefriargate – at no. 34-35 (former Burton's), the refurbishment work by Wykeland continues. In w/c 13/11, there was an application also to refurbish no.36 (Whitefriargate News) and create an internal link to the Burton's building (planning ref. 23/03339/LBC). We reported an application to install a new shop front at 36 Whitefriargate in the November Update.

# City Centre

- Demolition of the former BHS / Co-op building continues.

- Many people speak with sadness of the closure of Hammonds of Hull, Paragon Square, and the ground



floor is still empty, with no certain indication of a new use. However, the upper floors are still fully in use by ResQ call centre and in w/c 22/11, Leeds architects Crowther, Turner & Booth submitted an application on behalf of HoH landlord, Redefine Paragon Square (Hull) Limited, for:

1. Replacement of existing means-of-escape door with new glazed automated double door set to afford access off West Street to the West Street stairwell. 2. New passenger lift to access floors 3 and 4.

3. New passenger platform lift to afford level access to the property from the West Street elevation.

4. Refurbishment of the West Street Stairwell between Ground and fourth floor to renew finishes and make the area wind- and watertight.

5. New Lighting 1.8 Provision of new tenant signage and external lighting. (planning ref. 23/03453/FULL).

The application documents make it clear that a new roof terrace or "break-out area" is also to be created for the use of employees who currently take their breaks for fresh air or smoking on the pavement in front of the building.

- At the eastern end of West St, the former Hull Drawing shop, (briefly home to a Dark History Museum, from March to May 2019) is being refurbished with new shop front and new upper floor windows (observed 24.11.23)

#### East

- Kingswood – in w/c 27/11, there was an application to develop two parcels of land between Richmond Way and the River Hull with 214 homes in Zone A and 236 homes in Zone B and landscaped "aquagreen" for flood protection. (Planning ref: 19/01511/FULL)

In w/c 13/11, at St Philip's Church, Amethyst Rd, permission was granted for a single-storey side extension for use as a multipurpose hall and a rear extension for use as a store-room (planning ref Ref. No: 23/00229/FULL)

Conversion of 458-462 Holderness Rd, a former Kwiksave supermarket, into new uses has the subject of planning applications for many years. The application to change part of the front block into a restaurant came in February 1994 and the warehouse at the rear into a gym came in July 1995. The latest of several amendments to the current scheme for mixed retail, leisure and residential use was submitted in w/c 13/11. (Planning ref 23/03381/FULL)

- Work continues slowly on the listed property at 1 Jarrett St / 12 Grimston St. New wooden window frames and periodappropriate glazing have been installed (observed 6.11.23).



## <u>North</u>

- In August 2023, John Symons House in Park Row, off Park St seemed in danger of demolition, but hope of a new future for the handsome 1850s building came with a new and more sympathetic application for conversion to a 23bed house in multiple occupation submitted in w/c 6/11. (Planning ref. 23/03381/FULL)



It was announced on 6<sup>th</sup> December that Stepney had been chosen to be part of the Government's "High Street Accelerator Scheme" pilot programmes, aimed to rejuvenate shopping districts. Hull Civic Society has been invited to be involved, as this is a natural sequel to our involvement in the Beverley Rd Townscape Heritage Scheme, which will be completed at the end of March 2024.






Three views of Beverley Road at Stepney

One of the two Major Projects of the Beverley Rd THS was demolition and rebuilding of 52a-54 Beverley Rd, part of Brunswick Arcade. The scaffolding was removed, in early November, restoring Beverley Road's carriageway and pavement to its normal width and revealing careful attention to architectural detail in the rebuilding process. The other Major Project, the former Trafalgar Street Church, is now surrounded by scaffolding as conversion into a community centre progresses.









# Directions to the Holiday Inn Express (for the benefit of new members)

The street-level entrance on Ferensway is under a canopy between "Superdry" clothes shop and the Albemarle Music Centre & Hull Truck. There is a lift to the 1st floor reception and the meeting room is also on the 1st floor. If you are arriving by car, the best place to park is in the St Stephen's multi-storey car park (not to be confused with Tesco car park!), which costs a flat rate of £1 for any length of time after 6.p.m. There is a door from the car park into the 1st floor of the Holiday Inn Express. Unlimited tea and coffee will be available from the lobby next to the bar area.
