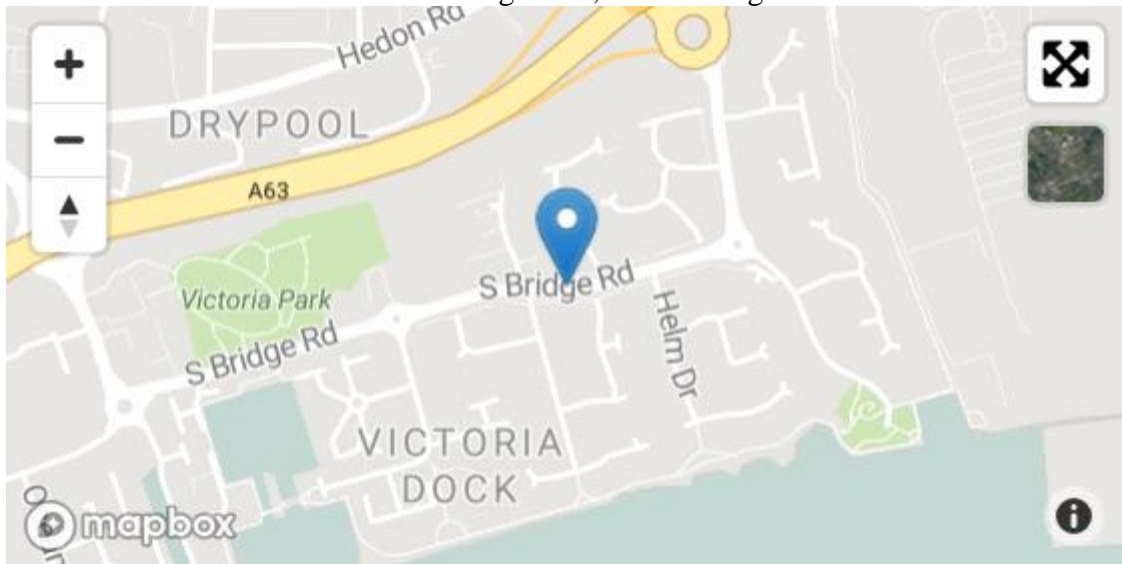

## Planning Report

### Decisions w/c 4.3.24

Change of use from offices (Class E) to 32-bed house in multiple occupation (sui generis use), including alterations to doors and windows

NORTH - Alan Wood and Partners 337 - 341 Beverley Road HU5 1LD Ref. No: 23/03425/FULL Status: Application Refused for the following reasons:-

1. The proposed development fails to provide sufficient off-street parking provision to satisfy the Council's parking standards due to the proposed layout and would result in unreasonable demands on the supply of on street parking in the area to the detriment of residential amenity and contrary to Policy 7(2)(c) and 32 of the Local Plan.
2. The conversion of the property into a 32 bedroom house in multiple occupation (HMO) would result in a concentration of similar uses in the area, adversely affecting local amenity and the character of the area, contrary to Policy 7(2)(a) of the Local Plan.

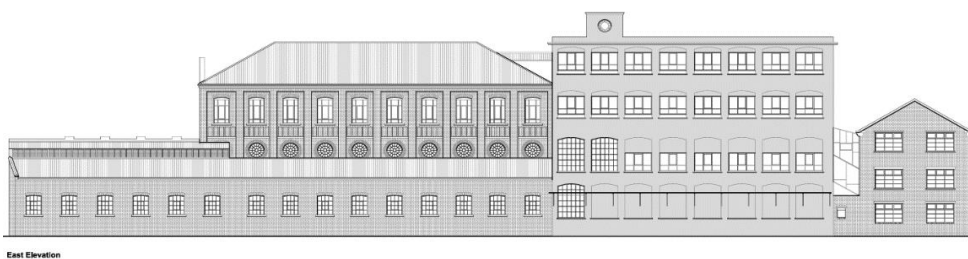

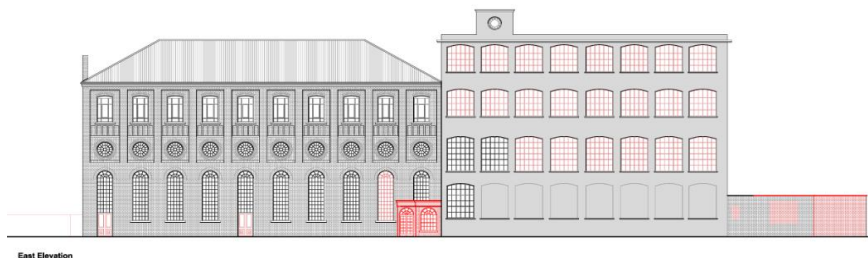

01) The proposed development of this area of open space is considered unacceptable due to the to the loss of the open natural area and the loss of trees that would occur and no assessment has been undertaken which identifies that the site is surplus to requirements, also the proposal does not include any replacement equivalent or better provision in terms of quantity and quality, and development is not for recreational provision, the needs for which outweigh the loss; contrary to Local Plan Policy 42 and NPPF Guidance.

02) The loss of the area of open space by this development would adversely affect the continuity and value of the Green Network and would not enhance the functionality and connectivity of the corridor, contrary to Local Plan policy 43 and NPPF Guidance.

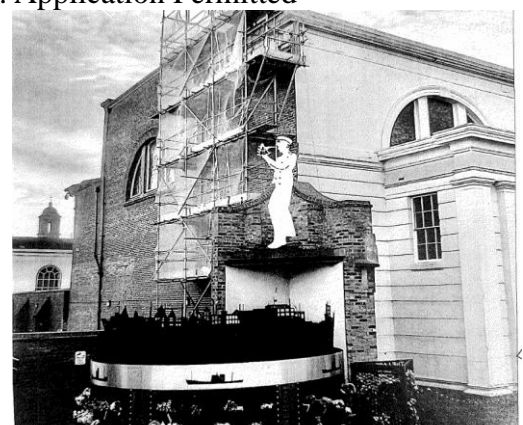
