Following the Society's AGM at 7.30pm and a short refreshment break, Dr. Alex Ombler (Curator, Goole Museum) explores the natural, industrial and social history of Hessle Cliff from pre-history to the present day. A little-known place on the north bank of the Humber Estuary, the cliff forms the southern-most tip of the chalk Wolds of Yorkshire. While the cliff has been of immense interest to geologists, it was also a place of industry. Quarrying and lime burning took place from at least the medieval period and during the 17th century, it became an important site for shipbuilding. The Industrial Revolution brought new developments to the cliff, not least the establishment of a new permanent settlement. As industry declined during the late 20th century, the cliff underwent regeneration and emerged as a place of waterfront leisure and living.

01. The internally illuminated ATM signage would be overly prominent and poorly related to the shop front in regard to the design, siting, materials and illumination. The adverts would further contribute to the unit's cluttered appearance and would negatively impact upon the character and appearance of the Georgian New Town Conservation Area and the setting of adjacent listed buildings, and is therefore contrary to Policy 20 of the Local Plan, SPD 8 - Advertisement Design Guidance and Paragraph 141 of the National Planning Policy Framework.

The following is an extract from the applicant's Planning Statement which highlights the national role of this development:

The Applicant has been an important supplier to the UK rail industry since 1995 and UK operations are managed by voestalpine Turnout Technology UK, (va TTUK), which already has a machining workshop in Edinburgh and a track layout assembly site at Harworth, near Doncaster.

va TTUK are now involved in the HS2 national infrastructure project with the supply of junction track layouts lasting from 2024 until the early 2030's. The layouts will be delivered to four project construction hubs by rail. The manufacture and assembly of components is very specialised work, which few plants are equipped to undertake. Components for these layouts will therefore be manufactured in voestalpine factories in Germany and transported to the UK by train via the Channel Tunnel. Supplying the project requires a rail-connected storage site in the UK, which the Freightliner Road site will function as.

The Applicant identified the Application Site in Hull as the most suitable site for operations and an application was subsequently submitted in 2023 (ref: 23/00409/FULL) and planning permission was granted for the development including the change of use of the land, installation of two rail sidings, erection of a warehouse building, two storey modular office building, single storey staff welfare units, plus associated car parking and fuel tank.

Now va TTUK are seeking permission for the creation of a third siding located alongside the two sidings with existing permission. This is an imperative requirement in order to meet the logistical demands of the HS2 national infrastructure project that they are committed to.

- Waterhouse Lane – Castle Buildings & Earl de Grey – rebuilding complete, all scaffolding removed and re-application of the original green tiles to Earl de Grey in progress (observed 24/6).
- Albion St – listed row of Georgian houses is becoming neglected in appearance.
- Albion St - Community Diagnostic Centre completed externally (observed 24/6).
- Union St – former coach houses – conversion into two 3-bed dwellings complete and “for sale” signs erected (observed 24/6).

East

- Great Union St – former Waterloo Tavern – scaffolding erected (observed 10/6)
- Wawne Rd – Netherhall – construction of 8 supported living bungalows is well advanced (ref 22/01113/FULL, approved 27.7.23) (observed 8.7.25)
